Bryan Murphy moved that the minutes of April 10, 2018, be accepted as presented. Rick Finuf seconded. Motion carried.

Luke Smith, Southern Star, gave a presentation on public awareness and safety.

Karen Gilpin, spoke about HONOR (Helping Our Neighbors Onward to Recovery), a group set up in the aftermath of the flood of 2007, in Iola.

Jason Tregon, Allen County Emergency Management, spoke about the National Weather Service, Wichita, ability to accurately read the weather in our area and the importance of storm spotters. Members were encouraged to sign up for Code Red.

He spoke about Debris management being an important issue after a weather related disaster.

Recovery is a phase of emergency planning that is often overlooked.

Angela spoke about companies that house hazardous material being mandated to report to KDHE, local health department, and LEPC. LEPC is aware of some companies that have not reported to KDHE.

Jason Trego provided the following updates:

- The committee updating the EOP have met and are gathering information.
- He anticipates having portions of the EOP ready to be submitted to the State by October.
- An exercise for agencies with CMS requirements will be scheduled.
- Plans to host a homeland security and exercise program.

Melissa Stanley, The Family Physicians, announced that they are an AHA Training Site, aligned with Finney County EMS. Also, The Family Physicians is hosting a diagnostic imaging mobile unit.

The next meeting will be the TEPW (Training and Exercise Planning Workshop). This is scheduled for October 9, 2018.
